

## ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SORORITY TO HOST PUBLIC MEETING DURING 88th <u>REGIONAL CONFERENCE IN CHICAGO</u> Several Local Organizations to be Honored for Service within the Windy City

CHICAGO – In conjunction with its 88<sup>th</sup> Central Regional Conference (CRC) being held in Chicago, IL, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.® will host its Public Meeting on Friday, March 18th, at 7:30 pm, at the Hyatt Regency Chicago. During the meeting, several local organizations whose services are in line with the sorority's programs of service will be honored.

Following the conference's theme of "The Charmed Life: A Taste of Excellence in the Windy City," members from across the eight-state region will assemble to conduct the business of the sorority, concentrating on implementing programs focused on five international targets. Those targets include "HBCU for Life: A Call to Action," in support of the country's historically Black institutions of higher education; women's healthcare and wellness; building an economic legacy; the arts; and maintaining a global impact; along with #CAP, the sorority's signature program providing counseling, mentoring and motivation for young people navigating the college admissions process.

While the majority of the conference is for sorority members only, the Public Meeting is one of the events open to the public.

Chicago-area residents and the category for which they are being honored at the Conference include Jahmal Cole, HBCU for Life: A Call to Action; Dr. Ngozi Ezike, Women's Healthcare & Wellness; Asiaha Butler, Building your Economic Legacy; Jackie Taylor, The Arts; and Euclid Williamson, the #CAP signature program.

Governor J.B. Pritzker and Lieutenant Governor Julianna Stratton will also be in attendance.

Distinguished women who boast excellent academic records, proven leadership skills, and involvement in local communities throughout Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and the cities of St. Louis and Cape Girardeau will attend the conference, along with sorority leaders from throughout the United States.
